

# Public Skating Rules & Skater Conduct

---

To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all skaters and spectators, the following rules and responsibilities must be followed while using the ice rink:

## General Rules for Public Skating

---

- No speed skating or speed skates allowed.
- No candy, soda, or any other food or drink on the ice.
- No horseplay, racing, playing tag, or other unsafe activities.
- No spraying or gouging the ice.
- Do not stop in the middle of traffic flow.
- All persons must go to the lobby during ice resurfacings.
- Do not sit on hockey boards or in the players' boxes.
- Use of foul language is prohibited.
- No shoes on the ice surface.
- No skates allowed on the concrete.
- Do not carry another person or child while skating.
- Do not sit in the bleachers with skates on.
- No wheeled devices on the ice (e.g., strollers, carts).
- No skating backwards.
- No phones or electronic devices on the ice.
- The skate guard's word is final.
- Violating any rule may result in ejection from the facility.

## Duties & Conduct of Skaters

---

### Ability:

Know your own skating ability and skate within those limits.

### Control:

Remain in control of your speed and direction. Always be alert to avoid contact with other skaters, spectators, and rink structures. When overtaking another skater, do so safely and with full awareness of your surroundings.

### Inherent Risks:

Ice skating involves obvious risks. By skating, you voluntarily accept those risks, which may include:

- Collisions with other skaters
- Falls and related injuries
- Contact with properly placed rink structures
